1. Rules

The race will be governed by The Racing Rules of Sailing (RRS) 2009-2012, the prescriptions of the United States Sailing, except as amended by the Notice of Race and these Sailing Instructions.

2. Entries

- 2.1 This is a limited local regatta. Only yachts owned or operated by members of either Milford Yacht Club or Windjammers Sailing Club, are eligible. Skippers may register by submitting an Entry Form to Milford Yacht Club, the race organizing authority. The Entry Form can be found online at the Milford Yacht Club web site under Racing. Yachts must have self-bailing cockpits, fixed berths, galley facilities and the ability to be self-supporting for a weekend cruise. In addition, yachts must have a valid PHRF certificate.
- 2.2 The MYC Sailing foundation's J/22's will be granted an exception to rule 2.1. They will race with the other boats, but will not be scored unless 3 or more J/22's race, in which case, they will be granted their own one design class and will be scored.

3. Changes to Sailing Instructions and Notices To Competitors

- 3.1 Changes to the Sailing Instructions will be posted on the official notice board outside the MYC Dockmaster's Office by 0900 the day of the race.
- 3.2 Notices to competitors, if any, will be distributed by the Race Committee via VHF ch 72. The Race Committee will also monitor this channel throughout the race.

4. Signals Made Ashore

- 4.1 Signals made ashore will be displayed on the flagpole behind the clubhouse at Milford Yacht Club.
- 4.2 Code flag "AP", Answering Pennant, with two horns means "the race is postponed; do not leave the harbor area." The first warning signal will be made no less than 60 minutes after "AP" is lowered.

5. Schedule of Race

Monday, May 30th, 2009 with First Warning no earlier than 1200.

6. Classes and Class Flags

The creation of Classes is at the discretion of the RC and will depend on participation. Class assignments, if any, will be posted on the notice board behind the Dock Office by 0900 and can be found on the Scratch Sheets. Class Flags are identified as follows:

- Class A - Red Flag
- Class B - White Flag
- Class C - Blue Flag

7. Racing Area

All classes will rendezvous at the starting mark of the MYC Olympic Circle, (see Appendix A for chart and details).

8. Courses and Marks

- 8.1 The Marks used are a combination of government navigational aids and MYC spars as described in Appendix A of these SI's. Marks are labeled A, B, C, D, E, F, W, P, L and N. The starting mark S, is in the center of the Olympic Circle.
- 8.2 Courses will be indicated by the Race Committee as a series of letters specified above.
- 8.3 There will not be a predetermined course diagram.
- 8.4 All of the above marks are to be left to port when rounding unless overridden by the Race Committee. When a mark letter on the Signal Boat posting board is circled, that mark is to be left to starboard when rounding.
- 8.5 Except when being rounded as a mark of the course, R"16" Charles Island Bell, R"2" Welches Point, and R"12" Pond Point shall be passed to seaward.
- 8.6 The Race Committee may designate a different course for one or more classes by posting the class letter(s) followed by the respective course.

9. The Start

- 9.1 Starting signals will be made in accordance with RRS Rule 26, with classes starting in alphabetical order. The starting sequence MAY or MAY NOT be a rolling sequence. It is up to the individual boats to watch for their Class Flag, which will designate the Warning Signal for that class.
- 9.2 The starting line will be between S, (an MYC Orange and White spar) and an Orange flag on the Signal boat.
- 9.3 Yachts NOT involved in a starting sequence shall keep clear of the starting area and those yachts preparing to start.

10. Recalls

- 10.1 Individual recalls will be signaled in accordance with RRS Rule 29.2. In addition, the Race Committee may attempt to notify the infringing boat(s) via VHF channel 72. Failure to notify will not be grounds for redress. This changes RRS 62.1 (a).
- 10.2 When a general recall has been signaled, the start(s) for the succeeding class(es) will be postponed accordingly.

11. Abandonment

The Race Committee may abandon a race in progress when a change in weather conditions has, in its judgment, made the race an unsatisfactory test of skill.

12 The Finish

The finish line shall be between the last mark signaled (or last mark for a shortened course) and a staff displaying an orange flag on the Race Committee Signal Boat.

13. Penalties

The 720 Turns Penalty, RRS Rule 44.1 applies

14. Time Limit

The Time Limit for each class will be 3 hours for the first boat to finish. For each class, boats failing to finish within 60 minutes after the first boat sails the course and finishes will be scored DNF without a hearing. This changes RRS Rule 35, 63.1, A4 and A5.

15. Protests

- 15.1 A yacht shall hail the Race Committee boat at the finishing line of its intent to protest and identify the protested yacht at the first opportunity after finishing or withdrawing.
- 15.2 Protests shall be written on forms available from the Race Committee.
- 15.3 Protests must be delivered to the Race Committee at the Milford Yacht Club within 30 minutes after the Race Committee docks. Protest Time will be posted on the Notice Board.
- 15.4 RRS 62.2 and 66 are changed to provide that requests for redress and requests to reopen a hearing must be delivered within 1/2 hour of the time final results have been posted.
- 15.5 Notice of Protest by the Race Committee or the Protest Committee will be posted on the Notice Board to inform boats in compliance with RRS 61.1(b).

16. Withdrawal

A yacht that retires from the race is asked to notify the Race Committee (Ch 72), or if that is not possible, the dock crew at the Milford Yacht Club (Ch 68).

17. Scoring

- 17.1 Boats will be scored using the Low Point method in accordance with RRS Appendix A.
- 17.2 Corrected finish order will be computed using the Time on Time Method with a B factor relative to average conditions of the day.

18. Awards

- 18.1 This race is part of a Holiday Series, Memorial Day, July 4th and Labor Day. The results of all three regattas will be combined with competitors being given one throw out. Awards will be given to the top three overall finishers in each class.
- 18.2 Awards will be presented at the annual MYC Fleet Banquet. The date is TBA.

- "First Substitute" (Yellow & blue pennant) General Recall
